

COMMON PUNCTUATION PATTERNS

1. **Independent clause.** (or ? or !)
2. **Independent clause; independent clause.** (The ideas in each sentence should be closely related when using a semicolon.)
3. **Independent clause;** therefore, **independent clause.**
however,
nevertheless,
consequently,
furthermore,
moreover, (etc.)
4. **Independent clause,** and **independent clause.**
but
or
nor
for
so
yet
5. **Clause, phrase
or word,** nonessential clause,
phrase or word, **clause, phrase
or word.**
6. If **dependent clause,** **independent clause.**
Because
Since
When
While
Although
After (etc.)

(Note: A comma is not needed after the introductory clause if it is short or of the omission does not make reading difficult.)
7. **Independent clause** if **dependent clause.**
because
since
when
while
although
after (etc.)
8. **Independent clause:** a, b, and c.
