

# Main Characters




#### **ROBERT PENN WARREN** 1905-89

Raised in Kentucky, Warren infused All the King's Men with the atmosphere of the South. He said he never would have written the novel if not for the politician Huey Long, his inspiration for the Boss. With its focus on the Boss, the novel conveys the corruption of humankind and the need to take responsibility.




### **Jack Burden**

#### **Anne Stanton**

Pure, elite woman; suffers disillusionment and degrades herself but recovers



#### Willie Stark

Also called the Boss; powerful governor who justifies his corrupt political path



#### **Adam Stanton**


Idealistic man; becomes disillusioned and is killed while assassinating the Boss
