

Consideration of Service Projects

Examples of activities that would and would not be accepted to meet the service requirement in ENGR 12X courses are provided below. Many service activities will include a leadership component; for example, organizing a 5K run to raise money for a charity would qualify, whereas just participating in the 5K would not qualify. Generally, the service project will involve donating your time to the University or the community. An activity that could be considered as recreational or related to a student's education may not count; for example, coaching an intramural team and working on the EcoCar project would not count. You should gain instructor approval before completing a service function (if you want to be sure it will count).

Helping with Girl Scouts or Boy Scouts	Running in a "Race for the Cure" 5K
Painting tables or equipment in labs (need sponsor)	Mowing Dr. Barker's yard
Calling BINGO at a nursing home	Coaching an intramural team
Teaching Sunday School	Working on EcoCar, Concrete Canoe or Steel Bridge
Helping with a children's choir	Going to Union Board meetings
